Why is men's involvement important to the movement in ending violence against women?

KUALA LUMPUR, [5th September, 2015] – According to a 2013 global review, 35% of women worldwide have experienced either physical and/or sexual intimate partner violence or nonpartner sexual violence. Looking at Malaysian statistics specifically, 4,807 cases of domestic violence were reported in 2014 alone, a 16.6% increase since 2013; 2045 cases of rape, a 26% drop since 2013; and 1590 cases of outrage of modesty, an 8% decline since 2013.

The White Ribbon Campaign is an international campaign, started in 1991, which works towards getting men involved in the movement to end violence against women. AWAM launched the White Ribbon Campaign in Malaysia in 2003. At the same time, AWAM initiated the formation of the Men's Action Network Against Violence (MAN.V) as the first men's group to work towards elimination of violence against women in Malaysia after a series of workshops with Dr. Michael Kaufman, the noted Canadian advocate who engaged men and boys in promoting gender equality.

As part of our ongoing campaign, prior to this year's run and walk, AWAM kicked off the campaign with the White Ribbon Public Forum themed "Power, Privilege, and Permission", intended as a space for discussion and dialogue between men and boys. The forum featured three speakers from various fields of expertise, who shared their experiences and insights as men who represent different aspects of society.

This year, AWAM aims to bring the White Ribbon Campaign to greater heights by introducing the AWAM's White Ribbon Ambassadors 2015 - a group of passionate and dynamic men to speak out against violence against women.

AWAM seeks to create a platform for men to actively engage and fight violence against women and simultaneously encourage families, communities and societies to create awareness about these issues and the social structures that limit women and men in the reproduction of fixed gendered roles and identities.
