

Gender-Based Violence (GBV)

Regional Sexual Harassment Workshop: Dimension Data

KL (16th-17th July), Indonesia (27th-28th Aug), Thailand (4th-5th Aug),

AWAM was invited to conduct a series of sexual harassment and discrimination workshops at the regional level for a company called Dimension Data. We have since conducted three workshops in KL, Indonesia, and Thailand. AWAM has also been invited to conduct these workshops at its other global branches, and is tentatively scheduled to conduct another workshop in the Philippines. Our Project Director Betty Yeoh conducted these workshops.

Discrimination can come in many different forms based on a person's identity. Factors such as ethnicity, religion, level of education, nationality, and physical characteristics are all some examples of attributes that can be discriminated against. The discussion focused on non-discriminatory women's rights. The participants were taught how to identify discrimination and sexual harassment via an interactive session, as well as made clear on the fact that women's rights are human rights.

Betty and Wei San were at a meeting with the Attorney General Chambers (AGC) to discuss amendments to laws pertaining to violence against women on Aug 7th. This forms part of a series of regular meetings hosted by the AGC, govt ministries and NGOs.

Betty attended a meeting with Jabatan Pembangunan Wanita on new initiatives to empower women on Aug 12th. Betty was on a panel to talk about the issue of violence against women at a Mrs Universe forum on Aug 24th. This forum was organised by SOGO KL, AWAM's partner in the nationwide domestic violence nationwide campaign.
