# Gender-Based Violence (GBV)

Betty appeared on Bernama TV on Nov 5th to talk on the topic of "Elimination of Violence Against Women." Specific focus was given to the root causes of violence as well as the ways in which AWAM can help give support to women who are facing domestic violence (i.e. through counseling, legal information, and training to empower women).



Every three months, AWAM welcomes chambering pupils who provide legal information to our Telenita clients as part of their chambering. On Nov 18th, there was a LAC (Legal Aid Clinic) Midterm Review. On Dec 16th, there were training sessions for chambering pupils before they started their work at the NGO clinics. Betty covered the sessions on "Feminism" and "Feminist Perspective on Laws". AWAM also organised a briefing on Dec 22nd at the AWAM centre. It was attended by pupils from the Selangor and Kuala Lumpur Legal Aid centres. The half-day briefing session by Aisyah briefed chambering pupils on AWAM's work, background and the standard of procedure.



On the <u>Nov 27th</u>, **Betty** carried out a lecture at ISM on Gender Sensitization. This was the third in a series of workshops for the social welfare officers under the women's ministry. The session covered the understanding of inequality between the genders, patriarchy, what is the impact of domestic violence, and what can be done to combat this.



On Nov 14th, Betty spoke at a sexual harassment forum at SEGI. The talk was also graced by the Head of Iowa University's network in Malaysia, who gave a brief speech about how education is the best change agent. There was much participation from the audience and at the end of the talk, several questions were raised on how to stop existing sexual harassment, as well as how to prevent it.

# Gender-Based Violence (GBV)

## Nationwide DV Campaign || Kelantan

AWAM, in collaboration with the Reproductive Health Association of Kelantan (ReHAK), organised a workshop on Domestic Violence (DV) in Kota Bharu on Nov 15th, as part of its on-going Nationwide DV Campaign. Thency and Wei Hoong represented AWAM. The aim of the workshop was to create greater awareness of DV at the grassroots level. Thency was one of the panel of presenters together with speakers from ReHAK, Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM), the One Stop Crisis Centre (OSCC) and a Syariah lawyer. Each shared their roles and responsibilities concerning their respective organisations and agencies including their first hand experiences in assisting DV survivors.



# SPECIAL REPORTS: WHITE RIBBON CAMPAIGN + 16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM

AWAM held its second White Ribbon Campaign Run and Walk at Padang Merbok on <u>December 7th</u>. With 2500 participants, half of whom were men, AWAM successfully brought the issue of violence against women to the community at large. This year's special addition to the White Ribbon Campaign was the Men In Heels: Walk A Mile In Her Shoes event. This was an opportunity for men to place themselves in women's shoes, to empathise with a woman's journey, and to engage with the issues of violence against women and girls. Approximately 30 men took part in this symbolic 100 meter walk before the flag offs of the walk and run. At Padang Merbok, men and boys from all walks of life made their pledges never to commit, condone or remain silent about violence against women and girls. Other people who graced the event included Pak Samad who read a poem to the crowd entitled "Ribbon Putih" and Ambiga, who gave a short speech onstage before the walk and run flagged off.





November 25th kicked off the annual 16 Days Of Activism Against Gender Based Violence. The objective of the campaign was clear - to raise awareness about gender-based violence as a human rights issue at the local, national, regional and international levels. In conjunction with this, AWAM held a 16 day long exhibition booth at Tropicana City Mall in which the public was encouraged to stop by to talk to us and learn more about Gender Based Violence, and what AWAM is doing to address this in Malaysia. Furthermore, two talks were also held at the AWAM Centre, titled "Sexual Harassment: Can It Affect You?" and "Violence Against Women: Can Men Play A Role To Stop Violence?"

#### Meeting With Wanita IKRAM



Representatives from Wanita IKRAM visited the AWAM Centre to meet with our members and staff on Nov 20th. The visit was a part of an on-going initiative in which AWAM and Wanita IKRAM are building bridges. The purpose of the visit was to propose a project that both AWAM and Wanita IKRAM can work on together in the future. We identified common interests and points of collaboration in our gender based violence as well as politicisation of ethnicity and religion work. Yock Lin, Beng Hui, Aisyah, Wei San, Timothy, and Lisha were part of the team from AWAM. AWAM hopes many meetings and collaborative efforts with IKRAM through the women's wing in the future.

#### **University Malaya Talk**



On <u>Dec 16th</u>, **Wei San** was part of a panel talk on how public education is an important component of advocacy and must supplement legal advocacy and law reform. She highlighted four examples that AWAM has taken part in or hosted: JAG Hentikan Rogol, White Ribbon Campaign, Wanita Suara Perubahan and The Good Malaysian Woman.

#### Pakistan Delegation



On <u>Dec 19th</u>, 11 delegates from Pakistan visited AWAM for a study visit. Lasting two hours, the meeting was led by Betty, who took them through the different areas of work AWAM does and the state of women's rights in Malaysia.


#### **GBM** Retreat




#### **AWAM Strategic Planning Meeting**
