# Gender-Based Violence (GBV)

**Emily** and **Wei San** attended a meeting with the Ministry of Women on <u>May</u> <u>26th</u> to give their input on the Plan of Action on Violence Against Women.





On May 30th, Betty conducted a training for service providers on how to create a "teen friendly" environment in health clinics. This training was done for staff from Klinik Kesihatan Taman Medan, a partner of the UM-KTP project. The workshop focused on gender sensitisation, values clarification and communication, with the objective of being more receptive to the problems of teenagers.

On <u>June 9th</u>, **Wei San**, **Yong Yi**, and **Evie** attended a policy dialogue on universal access to sexual and reproductive health. The aim of the meeting was to gather sexual and reproductive health experts, policy makers, government agencies, civil society organizations, advocates, and other key stakeholders in Malaysia to assess key sexual and reproductive health trends and issues in Malaysia and formulate recommendations towards the Post-2015 development agenda.





On <u>June 24-25th</u>, AWAM held a Victory Over Violence training workshop for service providers in the AWAM Centre, using a manual produced by the Women's Learning Partnership (WLP). Led by **Betty**, the session focused on sensitizing participants on violence against women, legislative challenges as well as advancements. Following that, participants were given the opportunity to formulate and conceptualise their own programmes for public education.

## PKR Training

On <u>June 27th</u>, Betty and Thency ran a gender sensitisation training session for a group of PKR town counsellors. They covered the issues of "what makes a man & what makes a woman", intersectionality, and values clarification.



# RRAAM Workshop

From July 24-26th, Wei San, Deepa, Yong Yi, Thency, Siew, Adrienne, and Kavitha attended the RRAAM Young Advocates Workshop. The workshop aimed to clarify issues and challenges of abortion and contraceptive services for young women, and to help participants acquire advocacy tools on the issue of reproductive rights.


## **SH Training for UNIMAS**

Betty and Thency ran a two-day sexual harassment training for UNIMAS students from July 26-28th. The training covered what constitutes sexual harassment, the causes and impacts of sexual harassment, structural solutions to sexual harassment, the different mechanisms through which sexual harassment can be addressed, how to intervene when sexual harassment occurs, basic helping skills on what to do for a survivor, and how to get participants to advocate for change. The participants were very keen to increase the awareness of sexual harassment using the different forms of multimedia.

"The sale of the aurat pants calls into question its necessity and role. Is this really a choice for women in labour, or are the manufacturers simply exploiting and cashing in on politicised Islam in Malaysia? We find it unthinkable that a business should attempt to profit off the trend of body-shaming and women's insecurities while further perpetuating arbitrary notions of what it means to be "modest". Any attempt to prey off women's insecurities and pander to misappropriated religious ideals needs to be critically examined if we wish to liberate women from this cycle of body-policing."

# Special Report: AWAM's 10th Annual Treasure Hunt



## Special Report: Hentikan Rogol: Stop The Rape Of Our Children!







On <u>July 7th</u>, the Citizens Against Rape (CAR) organised a walk themed #HentikanRogol: Stop The Rape Of Our Children, to protest against sexual violence against minors. The walk was held in response to the clear demonstration of injustice in the Sibu rape acquittal which saw a 60-year-old man walk away scott free after impregnating a 15-year-old victim with a semen-smeared finger.

AWAM was part of the Citizens Against Rape coalition formed in response to this, alongside other women's rights and children's rights NGOs such as SIS, WAO, SUARAM, KLSCAH, Childline Malaysia, Wanita IKRAM, MCRI and VoC. The protest drew a crowd of 400-strong, turning the west entrance of KL Sogo into a sea of orange. Armed with placards protesting rape such as "My Dress is not a Yes" and "My Body is not your Property", and dressed in orange to symbolise a bright future, the crowd remained energetic throughout the march to KLCC.

The beginning of the walk also saw a poignant speech made by a survivor of sexual assault highlighting the onerous process of navigating the legal process post-assault, as well as a poetry recital by national poet laureate A. Samad Said, speeches by President of Childline Malaysia, Datin P.H. Wong; the Executive Director of Sisters in Islam, Ratna Osman; and a member of Men Against Violence, Vernon Emuang.

A petition demanding for legislative changes and educational policies to better address rape, including the expansion of the current legal definition of rape, enhancing the weight of child's testimonies as well as introducing gender equality curriculums in schools, has garnered a total of 2,244 signatures.

## **GBM Summit**



On May 9th, GBM organised the GBM Summit on Civil Society: Post NEP - Towards a National Consensus. Yong Yi attended. It brought together individuals and CSOs to address the common interest for the whole nation of Malaysia, There are concerns about the deepening bridge between various groups in society, despite the continuous reiteration of the need to maintain harmony by the governmental officials and the NGOs supporting the cause.

On June 2nd, Thency, Evie, Siew, Kelvin, Aisyah, Adrienne, and Deepa attended a workshop themed "Understanding SOGIE and ASEAN". The workshop highlighted the numerous forms of discrimination and marginalisation faced by the LGBTQ community in Malaysia and Southeast Asia and the ways in which gender, sex, orientation, and identity intersect.

## Aiyoh Wat Lah! Awards



The 'Aiyoh Wat Lah!' Awards is an annual event by JAG intended to raise awareness on what constitutes sexism. misogyny, homophobia, and/or transphobia and to encourage higher standards of behaviour from public figures and institutions in relation to gender and sexuality. This year we received 1391 votes from the public. We also took our show on the road and held the event on May 10th at the Sarong Paloh Event Hall in Ipoh! In an amazing show of support, we had the largest number of people attending our Aiyoh event to date, and our #AiyohWatLah hashtag even became the #1 trending hashtag in Malaysia on Twitter during event day! Huge thanks to the organising committee!

From June 12-14th, AWAM staff members Wei San, Deepa, Evie, and Yong Yi attended the annual JAG Evaluation and Planning in Ipoh. Feminist Friday || June

On May 15th, AWAM hosted its fourth Feminist Friday of the year with the topic "Femininity in Feminism". Facilitated by AWAM members Sazlin and Jiun, this edition drew a crowd of 17 participants. There was a very fruitful discussion on the public images of Susan B. Anthony, Michelle Obama and Melissa Mayer, all of whom were successful women with conventionally feminine gender presentations. The session also included a discussion on the fine line between objectification and sexual empowerment, as well as the politics behind makeup and high heels.



On June 19th, AWAM hosted its fifth Feminist Friday themed "Pornography: Exploitation or Empowerment". Facilitated by AWAM intern Kelvin and WAO intern Weiling, this edition drew a crowd of 13 participants. The lively discussion revolved around numerous feminist and ethical issues surrounding pornography, including the treatment of performers, the perpetuation of gendered dynamics and the cognitive effects of viewing pornography. The participants also delved into a debate on racialised portrayals of people of color in pornography, highlighting the intersection between

AWAM hosted its sixth Feminist Friday of the year on July 21st, on the topic "What Makes A Woman?" for 16 participants. The discussion, facilitated by AWAM members **Ashley** and **Kelvin**, revolved around delineating the concepts of "sex", "gender identity", "gender expression" and "sexual orientation", as well as establishing the premise that gender identity is contingent on self-identification rather than biology. The session prompted the participants to reevaluate their vocabulary describing trans people and to divorce the synonymity between womanhood and vaginas/breasts. This edition of Feminist Friday also ended with a privilege walk, which provoked thought on our own position in society based on the numerous intersections of our identities (such as ethnicity, gender, class, etc).

## GBM Training of Trainers

From May 15-17th, Deepa, Baanu, and Ruby attended the GBM Training of Trainers which aimed to produce trainers with expertise as facilitators and in using creative media materials that will be used in local training and workshops. The training was based on issues of anti-racism and human rights.

## Psychology Dialogue Session



On July 14th, Emily and Siew attended a meeting with faculty from HELP University to offer their input, from an NGO's perspective, in reviewing the student curriculum, enhancing networking and partnership (internships) opportunities, as well as employability initiatives for students.



## Briefing on Appeal of Transgender Ruling

On <u>July 28th</u>, Evie and Kelvin attended a briefing organised by Justice for Sisters on the Negeri Sembilan transgender ruling. The briefing gave an overview on numerous issues including the contentions in the court case, the dual legal systems in Malaysia, the current legal penalties for Malay-Muslim transgender women, as well as global legal precedents.

On July 29th, Wei San, Evie, and Kelvin attended the Bersih 4 Press Conference at the EMPOWER office. The Bersih 4 rally will be held from Aug 29-30th, and calls for clean elections and a clean government.










On May 8th, Yong Yi and Yock Lin were in the TraxxFM studio to talk on the topic of "Women In The Workforce: Gender Equality". AWAM highlighted that gender stereotypes are one of the biggest barriers stopping women from pursuing careers in top management. Discrimination due to uncertainty about women's suitability for leadership positions is still largely prevalent.



On <u>June 22nd</u>, Wei San and Emily were on Bella NTV7 to talk about the issue of Domestic Violence. They covered statistics on DV cases as well as the holes in DV law in Malaysia such as how it does not cover intimate partner violence between unmarried couples.

On July 7th, Yong Yi, Evie, and Kelvin went into the TraxxFM studio to record five PSAs for AWAM on: rape, sexual harassment, domestic violence, the White Ribbon Run, and a general AWAM PSA. Listen out for us on Traxx, channel 90.3!


