Gender-Based Violence (GBV)

Talks @ Universiti Sains Islam Malaysia

Over the course of March and April, AWAM gave four talks at Universiti Sains Islam Malaysia In Nilai. We are grateful that we were given the opportunity to talk to the students and lecturers at USIM on a broad range of topics.









On <u>March 11th</u>, Betty spoke on the issues of family, the law on domestic violence, and its application. Around 20 students attended the talk and participated greatly in the informative session.

On <u>March 25th</u>, Wei San gave a lecture on the topic "A Woman's Journey through the lens of CEDAW". She highlighted statistics regarding women's position in politics, and the economy. She also explained the CEDAW version of equality. The attendees consisted of about 70 people including students and lecturers from the Faculty of Syariah & Law.

On <u>April 8th</u>, Thency conducted an interactive session on the topic "Understanding the Essence of Child Rights". There were about 20 to 25 participants.The session created a space to think about and to discuss why child rights is an important and relevant topic in their lives. One of the main points that was emphasized was that in everything we do, especially our actions and decisions related to children, a crucial question to ask ourselves is, "Is this in the best interest of the child?"

On <u>April 22nd</u>, **Betty** gave a lecture on Marriage and Divorce. She looked at the criteria for marriage, specifically focusing on girls below 21. She also covered the issues of what are the criteria for divorce and how the law works in the event that a marriage doesn't work out. Around 30 students in total attended the talk.

KTP: Young Person Leading to Action

From March 22nd-24th AWAM conducted the KTP workshop for 22 teenagers from a community in Selangor. This was the third of a series of workshops that were organized for the teenagers. At the end of this workshop, the participants went to a voting process to form their own youth club in their community. This club will serve as a platform for them engage their peers to in constructive activities and initiatives within their community. The participants shared that they had gained a lot from this workshop and were happy to have had the space to learn and explore various issues.



This year in conjunction with International Women's Day, AWAM held an event themed #DefineYourself on May 10th to encourage women to reclaim their own personal narratives and create new definitions of womanhood for themselves.

Over eighty people attended the celebration, taking part in a whole range of interactive games and activities, including a carnival like game where guests were able to "Smash the Patriarchy" in the form of knock-them-down pins. The pins each represented a form of discrimination and oppression women faced. There were also booths which offered a reflective space for quests to define who they wanted to be, and what they would do to make it happen for themselves.

Following the interactive segment, participants were treated to a wide range of performances. From artists, poets, thespians to dancers, women were given the space to express their creativity — celebrating their art with an engaged audience.

On <u>March 20th</u>, AWAM hosted its second Feminist Friday of the year on the topic of "LGBTQIPA". 16 people attended and participated and the sessions were facilitated by AWAM members Baanu and Ying Hui. Participants were asked to anonymously write down any questions they had about LGBTQIPA issues to clear any lingering doubts, and then were asked to get into pairs and discuss events and experiences in their lives regarding sexual orientation. The session ended with a discussion on an article about advancing LGBT rights in Malaysia.



On <u>April 17th</u>, AWAM hosted its third Feminist Friday of the year with the topic "Sex Education". Our members, Wei Hoong and Hui Chin facilitated the session which was attended by 8 participants. We played "Taboo" and it was a a-ha moment of the participants to notice the words we associate with the terms used in sex education. The participants then shared about their first encounter of sex education in our lives. The current state of sex education in Malaysia and its implication on the society was also discussed.

AWAM Orientation

On <u>March 28th</u>, the Membership Development Committee hosted the first orientation of the year. Other News and Events AWAM Gets a Makeover!


