

Gender- Based Violence (GBV)

In conjunction with Humanity Appreciation Day at Taylor's University, AWAM was invited to give a talk to 25 A-Level students on Sept 12th. AWAM member, **Yin Heng**, represented AWAM to talk about the issue of violence against women, with a focus on domestic violence. The students were also made aware of the impact of gender stereotyping which can be detrimental to academic performance. In addition, Yin Heng highlighted the work that AWAM does such as providing counselling services and legal information to women in crises.





On Sept 25th, **Betty** was interviewed by the online tv station, MOB.tv on the topic of sexual harassment. The interview covered what defines sexual harassment, the journey of the legislation surrounding sexual harassment, and what to do in cases of sexual harassment.

Betty attended the Trans-Partnership meeting organized by Women's Learning Partnership from 1st to the 10th of October in the US. The meeting focused on evaluating WLP partnerships after 15 years, and looked at the structure of the WLP partnership in terms for moving forward in the future. By working with the WLP partners, AWAM gains cooperation for training, campaigns, and advocacy work. Furthermore, this is a platform from which partners are able to expand their advocacy work from a local to global stage.





KTP Workshop for Youth

Bella NTV7 Interview

Oct 11-12th, Taman Medan

Together with UMMC, and the Health Clinic in Taman Medan, Betty, Aisyah, and Thency ran a focus group discussion using the open space concept with a group of youths from ages 12-16. The discussion revolved around the topic of teenage pregnancy and the challenges it has on the family. The workshop looked to addressing the issue of the lack of knowledge of sexual rights and reproduction in the Taman Medan area and to help the youth by raising their awareness on the topic.





Hospital Selayang Training

Sept 11th, Klang Valley

Hospital Selayang organised a regional One Stop Crisis Center (OSCC) training for service providers from hospitals in the Klang Valley, as well as a few other states. 150 people attended a Selangor training. **Betty** spoke about the role of NGOs in domestic violence, as well as the services AWAM provides for those who have experienced domestic violence.

Sept 15th, Kuala Lumpur

Betty appeared on a panel on Bella NTV7 to on a segment called 'Schoolgirl by day, callgirl by night'. The panel consisted of a counsellor, a UITM lecturer, and Betty. The topic of discussion revolved around the questions: What can we do for these individuals? Why do they get into the trade? What is the government doing to help? We cannot just judge these individuals at face value, and have to consider their backgrounds too.





AWAM, WAO, and SIS held its regular training for chambering pupils attached to their legal aid clinic on September 22nd. Sessions were facilitated by **Betty** and **Emily**, as well as other representatives from WAO and SIS.
