

# Gender-Based Violence (GBV)

### **SH Talk for Dimension Data**

From August 18th to 19th, Betty carried out a training on sexual harassment for Dimension Data employees. The training covered the definition of SH, the types and categories of SH, as well as the laws that cover SH. The participants also received information on the steps to take if they were to ever experience sexual harassment in the

### KTP UM Dah Kenal Apa Lagi Workshop

On September 6th, Betty ran a workshop session on basic helping skills for the healthcare providers at the Taman Medan Health Clinic. Around 25 participants attended the session. The workshop aimed to help create better communication skills between the healthcare providers and patients, in particular, youth, who come into the health clinic.

## **Training for D11**

From 24 to 26 August 2015 Betty and Thency conducted the Service Providers Training for PDRM-D11 on gender and VAW at the Child Interview Centre. Our interns and member, Adrienne, Kavitha and Yin Heng, also attended the training as part of their capacity building development. This training was organised by AWAM, with the support of Women's Learning Partnership (WLP). The objectives of this training are to raise awareness of the police officers on CEDAW and CRC, and to gender sensitise the front-liners so that they they deliver survivor-centered services

# WLP Pre-TOT + Advanced TOT on Human Rights

On October 19th-24th, Thency attended the WLP Pre-TOT + Advanced TOT on Human Rights in Beirut Lebanon. The TOT focused on deepening the trainers' facilitation expertise and testing new curriculum, including WLP's new manual on women's human rights.

# Training on Prevention of Child Sexual Abuse

On September 15, Betty ran a workshop in Johor for hearing impaired children on the topic of child sexual abuse. 15 children aged from 6-14 years, who ranged from partially to fully hearing impaired went through activities to highlight child sexual abuse (CSA) covering what CSA is, how it can happen, and how children can take action. A half-hour briefing was also held for the parents of the children to help put both parents and children on same page.

## **BGM on Marital Rape**

On October 10, AWAM hosted a Big Group Meeting on the topic Marital Rape in light of recent denials of the act and contentions on the term. Panel speakers invited were Dr Ahmad Farouk Musa (IRF), Datin Paduka Che Asmah Ibrahim (Wanita IKRAM), and Jason Liang (Wong & Partners). Speakers presented on reconciling the controversial fatwa claiming that 'women have no right to refuse her husband's sexual demands' with principles of Syariah; using the term 'marital rape' in Islam where marriage is supposed to be founded on mutual partnership; and understanding the complications faced in convicting rape cases due to definitional issues and limitations of the law. Panel speakers and attendees agreed that marital rape must be set against the wider context of VAW, and within marriage specifically, domestic violence.



# Politicisation of Ethnicity & Religion (PER)



#### PER Concepts and Trainer's Training

From 18th-20th September, the PER Committee organized a Concepts and Trainer's Training to provide the participants with a platform to share and discuss concerns or questions around understanding and using the manual, to updateimprovements to the manual, and to sharpen their understanding of concepts so that they can better articulate and convey the messages of the manual.

#### PER Workshop for FHRAM



From 21st-23rd October, a PER Workshop was conducted for 15 youths from the Family Planning Association UPM's Health and Sciences Faculty, aged between 18 and 25 years old. Wei San and Sazlin led the training. The participants reported that they were motivated and felt they can now do something with the new information as well as reported that they are more open to questioning existing patriarchal beliefs.

From October 30th to November 1st, the PER Commitee took their training to Penang to run a youth workshop with Aliran. 25 participants attended the workshop, and the training was conducted by Thency and Pui Yan. The workshop was a big success and participants got the message of the workshop with some teachers saying they would even like to use some sessions in their classes.

From November 6th to 8th, a youth workshop was held for 16 youth participants from the Gender Studies department at Universiti Malaya. Thency and Syar conducted the training and the participants were very engaged in the topic.

### White Ribbon Forum

This year, prior to the run and walk, AWAM kicked off the campaign with the White Ribbon Public Forum themed "Power, Privilege, and Permission", intended as a space for discussion and dialogue between men and boys. Approximately 40 participants took part in the discussion, which featured speakers from various fields of expertise. AWAM seeks to create a platform for men to actively engage and fight violence against women and simultaneously encourage families, communities and societies to create awareness about these issues. ## White Ribbon PC



AWAM's White Ribbon Press Conference was held on on November 3rd, and included men of all ages, and from all walks of life holding weights of different sizes to symbolise the varying burdens that women have to deal with on a daily basis. This is AWAM's third public event to call on men and boys to be part of the solution to end violence against women. This year, we highlighted the theme of "The Story of a Generation," where a generation of men and boys of all ages come together to end violence against women.

## White Ribbon Run Event Day

AWAM held its third White Ribbon Run at Padang Merbok on November 22nd. With approximately 1000 participants in attendance, AWAM successfully emphasised that Gender-Based Violence (GBV) and Violence Against Women (VAW) are not solely women's rights issues, they are human rights issues and we should all be involved in addressing it.
